- By-Laws were adopted in July of 2016.

# Pastoral Council

## Our Accomplishments

- Council meetings were held monthly with optional virtual attendance via Zoom.
- Recruited two parishioners to assist in the implementation of new signage for the campus.
- Hosted our annual Parish Appreciation Dinner in February 2023 with over 100 in attendance.
- Held elections in the Spring where we welcomed 3 new members: Neda Biggs, Annemarie Hamilton and Ashley Wilson.
- Provided refreshments for the fellowship following the dedication of the new Saint Joseph statue on March 19, 2023.





# Pastoral Council

## Our Accomplishments

- Organized a combined Pastoral Council dinner in July 2023 for members of Saint Polycarp and Saint Dennis Councils.

# Building & Maintenance Committee



- Developed a system to track, plan and resolve maintenance issues around our parish campus.
- Since November 2016:
  - Received over 437 maintenance reports with a 97% resolution rate
  - Saved our parish contracting costs for repairs
  - These issues ranged from faulty receptacles and burnt-out lamps to broken outside Stations' posts and clogged drains



# Building & Maintenance Committee Accomplishments



- Organized the Annual Fall and Spring Parish Grounds Cleanup.
- Replaced batteries in all the emergency lighting around the parish campus.
- Replaced all 75 fluorescent lamps in PSR attic and basement with LED lamp
  - Utilized donated type A lamps that work with a ballast.
- Installed two more EXIT lights in the Mother Drexel Hall as per fire occupancy code.
- The audio in the church cry room was weak and intermittent.
  - Troubleshoot problem to a faulty volume control potentiometer.
  - Corrected the problem by replacing the volume control.

# Christian Formation Committee

## Parish School of Religion (PSR) - 2022

- Successful year of classes; mix of in-person classes with PSR online lessons once a month to promote family catechesis
- Children's Liturgy of the Word; held twice a month during the school year.
- First PSR Envelope Fundraiser; Confirmation students decorated envelopes
- Christmas Ornament Fundraiser
- Saint Jude Bike-a-thon held on October 16; raised over \$6000.
- All Saints Day Parade Trunk or Treat; 16 ministries/councils; well attended by students and families.
- Deacon Charlie Memorial Advent Poster Contest; over 50 posters judged by The Robinson Family.



# Christian Formation Committee

## Parish School of Religion (PSR) – 2022

- The Nativity Pageant; made a comeback after COVID—well attended
- “World’s Finest Chocolate” fund-raiser; sold 71 cases; donated 5 cases to frontline workers
- 16 students made First Eucharist & 14 students made Confirmation
- May Crowning held on May 7; well attended; Sodality hosted Agape
- The Catholic Youth & Young Adult Ministry Recognition Dinner held on May 22 (Newark, DE)
  - Dylan Champlin received the St. Timothy Award
  - Izabella Koprowski received the St. Timothy Award
  - Rich DeZao received the St. John Bosco Award
  - Christine Schumacher received the Volunteer of the Year Award



# Christian Formation Committee

## Parish School of Religion (PSR) - 2023

- PSR classes began on Sept 24/26; 95 students; 8 new families
  - We continue to have a mix of in-person and online classes
- Children's Liturgy of the Word is offered twice a month
  - Lead Catechist is Anna Skinner
- Envelope Fundraiser continues to be a success
- "New" Christmas Ornament Fundraiser was created
- Saint Jude Bike-a-thon was on October 15; exceeded our goal again
  - Raised \$6000+; 40 participants; many volunteered to help the day of event
- Annual All Saints Day Parade Trunk or Treat (10/29) was our biggest event yet
  - 20 ministries/councils gave out goodies
  - Over 50 students and all catechists and assistants dressed as saints
- Every PSR classes prays the adoration prayer weekly and all classes attended eucharistic adoration



# Christian Formation Committee

## Order of Christian Initiation of Adults

- The name of RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) was changed to OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) in November of 2021 and is gradually being introduced in the Church.
  - OCIA reflects a closer translation of the process by which adults are initiated into the Catholic Faith.
- Four Candidates received their Sacraments of Confirmation at Easter Vigil.
  - Two of these entered full communion with the Catholic Church.
  - The Second Vatican Council reinstated what was referred to in the early Church as the “catechumenate,” a process of initiation for adults that culminates in Baptism.



# Christian Formation Committee

## Order of Christian Initiation of Adults

- Inquiry sessions for RCIA were held at the end of the summer. The St. Dennis OCIA team and participants have joined our team and participants for the 2023-2024 classes to learn more about running the OCIA in their parish. This is the first time in many years that St. Dennis has people going through the process.
- St. Polycarp has our first catechumen in several years, going through the process this year.
  - This is our largest class since Deacon Frank started working with the OCIA.
- There are 7 Candidates and 1 Catechumen from St. Polycarp and a total of 5 on the St. Polycarp OCIA team, including Deacon Frank.
- There are 2 candidates from St. Dennis, and they have 5 people, including Jennifer Hinton, the parish's Director of Religious Education, on their OCIA Team.

# Digital Ministry

The Digital Ministry began meeting in October 2021.

Meetings are held on the third Thursday of the month.

We have had 88 tech-related issues or requests that have come up in a variety of areas including Live Streaming, Wifi/Internet connections, Website, email and other software.

79 have been resolved

3 are “on hold”

6 are “open”





# Digital Ministry Mission Statement



- The technology in our church is made up of various digital platforms that are being used by the parish in a variety of ways.
- The digital ministry is designed to support all ministries of the parish that utilize these technologies as well as develop strategies and enhance the technologies being used by the parish.
- This ministry is unique in that there are many individuals involved in aspects of this ministry merely by the fact that they utilize such technologies in their own ministry and as such they will be key supporters of this ministry.

# Digital Ministry Mission Statement

## 1) IT Solutions –
