## LITURGY

#### THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation. The Church teaches that after Mary died, her body and soul was assumed (taken up) to Heaven.

The Church has celebrated The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary since the sixth century. Pope Pius XII declared this essential teaching a dogma of the Church in his apostolic constitution, Munificentissimus Deus. in 1950. This dogma states: "the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory". Pope Pius XII, in the apostolic constitution, writes multiple times that Mary died before being assumed into heaven.

The St. Vincent de Paul Society has grown from a couple of college students 191 years ago who were challenged to put their Catholic Faith into action by their fellow classmates. The Society is a worldwide Catholic Lay Organization in over 153 Countries with over 1 million members. In the United States, there are over 100,000 members in 155 Dioceses providing over \$3.4 Billion dollars in assistance to 5.4 million people by making over 550,000 home visits and another 1.5 million contacts with people in prisons, hospitals, nursing homes and food pantries.

The vocation of the Society is to follow Christ through service to those in need and so bear witness to His Compassion and Love. Vincentians show their commitment through person-to-person service and seeing the face of Christ in the people we serve. Members of the St Vincent de Paul Society at St Polycarp Church have assisted 73 families and individuals during January through June 2024. This help totaled \$16,056 and helped our parishioners and neighbors with rent, mortgage payments, utilities, medicine, transportation, and food. None of this would be possible without donations to the poor box and individual donations to St. Vincent de Paul Society.
