Today, Sunday, December 1st, marks the beginning of a new liturgical year in the Church. The Advent Season always signals a new Church Year. What resolutions will you make for this new Liturgical Year?

LITURGY OF THE WORD -CYCLES OF THE CHURCH YEAR



In the Roman Rite, the Mass is made up of two principal parts: the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Mass begins with the Introductory Rites and ends with the Concluding Rites.

The Liturgy of the Word contains the First Reading, Responsorial Psalm, Second Reading (on Sundays and solemnities), Gospel Acclamation, Gospel, Homily, Profession of Faith (on Sundays, solemnities, and special occasions) and the Universal Prayer.

There are three Sunday Cycles (Year A, Year B, and Year C). Over the course of three years, you will hear from all of the Gospels. With the new Liturgical Year, the readings heard at Sunday Mass will now be from Year C. In Year C, we hear the Gospel of Luke. The Gospel of John is read during the Easter season in all three years.

The first reading is usually from the Old Testament and reflects important themes from the Gospel reading. The second reading is usually from one of the epistles, a letter written to an early church community.



LITURGY

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION A Holy Day of Obligation



The Catholic Church teaches that Mary was without Original Sin from the moment of conception.

This year, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, December 8th, falls on a Sunday, the Second Sunday of Advent. The Sunday Liturgy takes precedence over the Holy Day. Therefore, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, will be transferred to_Monday, December 9th. It is a Holy Day of Obligation.

Accordingly, the faithful have two obligations:

1. To attend Mass either Saturday evening or Sunday morning to fulfill the obligation for the Second Sunday of Advent

4 pm Vigil Mass on Saturday, December 7th 10:30 am Mass on Sunday, December 8th

2. To attend Mass either Sunday evening or Monday to fulfill the obligation for the Immaculate Conception.
4 pm Vigil Mass on Sunday, December 8th
8:30 am Mass on Monday, December 9th
(St. Dennis – Monday, December 9th at 7 pm)

Many people wonder why they just can't attend the Sunday evening Mass and fulfill the obligation for both. The Readings for each Mass are different. One set of readings is for the Second Sunday of Advent and one set is for the Holy Day.
